Perchance during the preparation of some notes about exactly 50 years ago (1967) the current edition of the Clarion was delivered and what should I discover but something which neatly tied in with my

in the Claim was actively all what should I discover but sometiming which heavy the lift with my jottings and the page devoted to shops/good ideas, that subject being Estate Agents. I wonder if fellow readers would like to be reminded that, if they purchased a semidetached residence that year, it would cost on average £3,250, whilst, for the more affluent investment, a new bungalow would have been somewhere between £4000 and £6500. With a motor car to match each category at £450 for a mini, while £750 bought a family sized car. You needed at least one bedroom suite (£60 -£85) and a three piece suite (£80-£100) and to stroll around the house a lady wore a day frock at £8, whilst a gents suite varied between £13´- £20, If either of you smoked then the cheapest range of cigarettes, Park Drive & Woodbine, were 4s.2d for 20. Your daily paper was 4d whilst a comic cost between 6d and 8d. Wireless licence was just £1 whilst mono TV was £5. Vegetables were cheap, with home grown tomatoes at 2s 1d a pound, bananas at 1s 3d lb, runner beans 1s lb, potatoes 4d lb.

One could go on and on, but for the shop around housewife some white bread was 1s 4d per loaf,

butter 3s 11d lb, sugar 81/2d lb, Biscuits 2s lb, smoked bacon 5s lb, Jam 4s10d for 2lb

Wages: before rushing into making comparisons with today's prices best consider some values of pay 50yrs ago. Policeman maximum £20 per week, refuse collector £13.10s, furniture salesman £18, farm worker £13.10s but with tied cottage thrown in, bank clerk age 31 £21.10s And finally how about this; in 1875 a man could go out with 6d in his pocket making for his local where

he had a pint of best bitter, bought 2oz of thick twist tobacco and a box of matches and had a 1/2d left.

•Western Bank bridge repairs are causing reliability issues. Should be finished in June.

•Tapton School are consulting on changing their closing time making it 10 minutes time difference from King Edwards, which may result in changes to timetables to accommodate travel requirements.

Overnight road re-surfacing on Manchester Road may require diversions or other tempo-

rary changes late May-June.

•There will be some small fare increases on 7th May, day tickets increase by 10p as well as an increase for weekly tickets. Single fares remain unaltered.

•The Western Bank stop will not be in use until the works are complete.

•A resident reported buses were running with passengers on over Selbourne Road. This is unusual and will be investigated.

•Residents advised to keep outbuildings locked.
