REGIONAL MAYOR @ CROSSPOOL FORUM MEETING

Oliver Coppard, the South Yorkshire Mayor and local resident, has been involved in politics in the region for a long time.

Elected as mayor eighteen months ago, with a vision for improving the area. He said: "South Yorkshire has no shortage of challenges to address" and that he is committed to making a difference.

One of his main priorities is transport, which he said is "not fit for purpose at the moment", and that public transport should be a public service and a world class one. He intends bringing public transport back into public control, starting with the trams in 2024, and to look into a bus franchise model similar to Manchester and Leeds.

Another priority for him is health, which he said is "huge" to him. He leads an integrated care partnership called "South Yorkshire Healthcare", whose aim is to reduce the gap in life expectancy between the richest and the poorest people in the area, currently 20 years, and focuse on the early years of development as part of this.

His third priority is economic growth, which he said is lacking in Sheffield for a big city. He wants to fix this by investing in advanced engineering, digital health care and other sectors that can make the region fit for the future. To involve the people in his plans, he is launching a regional citizens' assembly of 100 people who will represent the diversity of South Yorkshire.

Finally he said: "people have lost trust and faith in politics" and he wants to change that. The Police & Crime Commissioners' role will be merged with the mayor's office next year, according to sources. This will give the mayor access to different funding streams for public safety and crime prevention.

LYDGATE LANE WAR HOSPITAL

Many of us who live in Crosspool are well acquainted with Lydgate Infants, either through the daily school run (past or present), or just as the great landmark that it provides to our community, but what is less well known is its contribution to our locality in its earliest days.



After being open for just six years, the school closed its door to children shortly after the First World War broke out in 1914, and was requisitioned by the Army Medical Corps as an Auxiliary Hospital for recuperating troops from the Western Front, being a detachment of the 2nd (Northern General) Hospital in Sheffield. Its normal attendees spent the duration of WWI being tutored in the Wesley Hall Sunday School, at that time on School Road, and for nearly four years up to one hundred soldiers at a time made the building their temporary home.

Information regarding exact details are hard to come by – a few photos exist, as well as discharge documents from other 'higher need' military hospitals (primarily Winter Street) – but some gleanings can still be made from this.

We know that the halls of the school provided dining and living space for the men, with long trestle tables of up to 20 men set out in rows. They slept in classrooms, which would have acted as wards, and the set up itself, complete with nurses and medical staff (including doctors) overseeing it all.

The soldiers, who wore what were known as 'hospital blues' uniforms to show their recovering status were allowed to mix freely with the community and many Crosspool groups put on tea parties and concerts for the entertainment of the men, both on and off site.

One of the most interesting facts is that almost all of the men staying there between 1916 and 1918 were suffering from a variety of illnesses and diseases contracted in the trenches, rather than specific (and possibly more expected) gun or shell wounds. Several were treated for 'nervous disorders' (ie. shell shock), but again this was a minority compared to those with trench feet, dysentry or inflammation of the kidney.

There is a list of soldier's names attached to these documents in the Sheffield Archives, and from this it is possible to see that these soldiers came from across the UK, and sometimes even Commonwealth, to stay at Lydgate. Very, very few were from Sheffield. My personal favourite is an engineering Pioneer (same rank as a Private soldier) named Q. Paki who originated from New Zealand and belonged to an exclusively Maori-raised regiment; I feel for him having become ill half a world from home, only to find himself left in the what was then isolated rural backwater of Crosspool.

Contrary to a legend that was spread around the school in the 1980's that it was haunted by a soldier in the tower at the top of the school, there is no record of any soldier having succumbed to his wounds, and indeed most left being fully recovered and either fit to return to duty or to be discharged!

The school might have gone back to usual after the war ended, but its vital role deserves to be remembered by our community in this autumn. *Dan Eaton*

OPEN MEETING-BULLET POINTS-THURS 28TH JULY 2023

Eighteen Crosspool residents, and seven members of the Forum Management Committee attended. The 19th AGM, with Cllr. Tim Huggan & South Yorkshire Mayor, Oliver Coppard. Ian Hague (chair) welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Minutes of 2022 AGM held 27th Oct and agreed as true record?

Chairman's Report: Just a few neighbourhood issues since our last AGM.

-Site of the former Plough Inn remains a demolition site, no construction activity observed.

-Site of the former Motor World, planning application submitted for its development.

-An application for the development of four allotments at Bole Hill Rd is under review by the Secretary of State, as is the right-of-way issue at Clough Fields.

-A planning application has been submitted for the removal of three TPO trees and build a detached house on land at the corner of Coldwell Lane and Moorbank Drive.

New electric bus trialled on the 51 bus route. New dropped curb with white 'H' sign installed outside Benty Lane Scout Hall, to allow easier access for people with limited ability.

Fresh ideas, stories & events are always welcomed – as are participants for Tues morning for Easy Exercise (more men), Wed morning Tai Chi classes and Sat morning helper to maintain

the Lydgate Green flower beds.

Ian expressed his gratitude for the sponsors & advertisers, the cooperation of the councillors and the police. With everyone "sharing the same vision" for Crosspool "working towards the same goal". He also thanked the committee, the Festival team, and in particular his vice chair and colleague Steve Reynolds, for his continued help and hard work in order that Crosspool remains a good place to live.

Treasurer's Report: John Drinkwater. said "we are ahead of the game" & despite the poor weather at the Summer Fayre, the accounts show a "nice profit" for the year. Full accounts were available for anyone to peruse. The Calendar sales, & Christmas tree shredding made money, & Festival Week made enough for £600 cheques to be sent to both Assist & the S6 Food Bank.

He expressed disappointment that the precinct does not appear to have been granted anything from the Council's Economic Recovery Project (ERP) – and in particular that he had had no communication from them.

There were no resignations this year. The floor gave a show of hands to give the Forum committee a mandate to continue. More Management Committee members are needed.

Police Report: Pam Thompson (PCSO update from 28/7/23 to 25/10/23

BURGLARIES: Melfort Glen-Den bank Crescent-Benty Lane-Dransfield Road. Mainly vehicles have been stolen from these properties.- BMW, Audi and Seat Ibiza. MO - Euro Locks and locks tampered with.

ATTEMPTED BURGLARIES: Dransfield Rd-Ringstead Ave-Cardoness Rd. MO-Locks tampered with.

THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLES: Benty Lane – Tools stolen from Van.

THEFT OF MOTOR VEHICLES: Marsh Lane - Sportage Kia - Several males from another area of Sheffield have been arrested for theft of motor vehicles. Being processed.

A regional citizen's assembly of 100 demographically representative people is about to start. **Questions from the floor** included the need for a second A & E Dept (the city originally had three), social care problems – "incredibly neglected", the HS2 scrappage and what this means for investment - no direct trains to Manchester or Leeds Bradford Airport, - buses being run for profit on unsuitable narrow roads, the closure of Doncaster Airport, the recent bad storm damage & flooding of footpaths etc from Storm Babet. Mr Coppard agreed with them allsadly his first priority for NHS funds is to get Doncaster Royal Infirmary repaired before it falls down; he has had no real answers to his queries re HS2 money but is opening the conversation again. Some of the ideas proposed do not make sense for us – the stations and lines can not take any more trains. He agreed it was hugely important to get better train links to the airports - and to get back control of the Doncaster Airport site. Active Travel; England is now

focussing just as much on getting people walking as on cycling – so foot paths are important. Feasability studies are taking place – e.g. to reopen the rail link to Stocksbridge for a tram.

Councillors' Questions & Reports:

- Tim Huggan agreed it was disgraceful we had not been kept in touch with the Council Officers for the Economic Recovery Fund, Crosspool bid, and will look into this...
- 2.Tim thought the Forum should invite the chair of the local LAC to the next Open Meeting & he would push for the officers to attend.
- 3. Council officer Mubarak has been asked to find out what sort of Anne Murphy memorial (for Lydgate Green) would be acceptable to the Parks dept – we do not require another bench for the green.
- 4. There was strong feeling that Sandygate Rd at least needs one of the battery-operated pedestrian crossings (as seen on Crookes, Crookesmoor or Osborne Rd, Nether Edge) as there is a length of 2 and a half miles with no form of crossing at all. Dangerous for people getting to the Claremont Hospital, Hallam Schools, golf club paths etc.
- 5. Hand-held speed camera training? Apparently we now need a risk assessment of exactly where someone intends to stand plus expensive special HiVis jackets!! (Ruth Milsom).

ELECTRIC BUS TRIALS

If you have traveled by bus in Crosspool, you may have seen a new addition to the 51 route.

An electric vehicle has been operating on this route since the first week in September, as part of a trial to reduce emissions and noise pollution. The electric bus is quieter, cleaner and more efficient than the diesel ones, and it also has a modern design and features. The trial is expected to last for several months, and if successful, more electric buses could be introduced on other routes in the city.

First Bus, a UK bus operator, is running a pilot project to test electric and hydrogen buses in Sheffield. The company chose Sheffield, and especially the 51 route, as a challenging environment to measure the performance and range of the vehicles on steep hills and gradients. The project aims to demonstrate that if the buses can run efficiently in Sheffield, they can do so anywhere.

This is part of a trial of different models from various manufacturers, starting with the Volvo BZL double-decker going (from Lodge Moor 0716, 0935, 1152, 1414, 1645, 1924, 2120, and 2320) on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The trial schedule may change, but the aim is to keep the

electric vehicles on the 51 route as much as possible. It has parallels with trials going back to the 1970s (see below image of the 'famous five trials') as well as the far more recent trials up to and including 2014.

First Bus would appreciate people offering some feedback where possible on things like comfort, ride quality, noise, layout, etc.

Assist was set up 20 years ago to address the needs of people who have claimed asylum and received negative decisions on their asylum claims. At the point of refusal, people face destitution because their asylum support ends imminently. Previously people were given 21



days by the Home Office to leave asylum support accommodation but recently we have seen a rise in 7 day notice periods on asylum support discontinuations, and consequently expect a huge increase in people needing help from charities like ours.

ASSIST offers accommodation, financial and casework support to our clients. We offer specialist advice, signposting and referrals to local organisations for legal representation and social outlets. This is vital to give people the best chance to regularise their immigration status where possible, and improve their wellbeing and social connections.

ASSIST has a Client Consultation Group which is a group comprised of current clients who meet monthly to discuss the ASSIST support package and offer feedback and suggestions for improvement, and has been going for 18 months.

ASSIST currently support 55 people, of whom 35 are accommodated. There are currently no people on a waiting list for ASSIST support.

We are able to do our work because of the generosity of funders, partnerships and donations like your amazing collection of £600 at the Crosspool Festival.
