PRECINCT FESTIVE CHRISTMAS

The Crosspool shopping precinct had a festive look thanks to the Christmas trees with sparkling lights, provided by the Valley Side Garden Centre and decorated by community volunteers.

Crosspool Forum coordinated this event, which brought together groups of people on a cold Sunday December morning to brighten up the area.

The volunteers and local businesses showed remarkable generosity and spirit by donating their time and resources to make the precinct more



festive. Steve and Ian are very grateful to them and to Direct Travel, who kindly let them use their concourse to set up and decorate the Christmas trees.

Recognising the importance to dispose of our real Christmas trees sustainably rather than end up in landfill, which is both costly to the taxpayer and the environment, on Sunday morning 7th January, the Forum had arranged a brief window for the community to drag their discarded Christmas trees to the forecourt in front of local travel agents "Direct Travel."

The huge number of Christmas trees brought for recycling were soon reduced to wood chippings by Andy Clayton (local tree surgeon) and his team for mulch, outdoor firewood,

animal bedding and pathways locally.

It was gratifying to hear the residents of Crosspool appreciate the hard work of the volunteers and the convenience of being able to dispose of their Christmas trees environmentally friendly.

Ian Hague (chair) welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Chairman's Report.

We are always in need of more volunteers for the Forum and are happy to have Steph and Ciarán join us this year. Please let us know if you or someone you know is interested in participating. As a 'thank you' for their work, Clarion deliverers have been invited to a Pie and Pea supper and entertainment at the Hallam Football Ground in February,

Steve was proud to announce that Ian has just been awarded a BEM in the New Year Honours! (It has taken over 5 years to get this through – the covid years not helping, and many thanks were due to the late Cllr. and resident Anne Murphy for her support in this, a great person and a true friend of our community. Ian expressed his thanks to the Vice Chair Steve Reynolds and the Management Committee for their congratulations.

Treasurer's Report

John said the Forum is doing all right – with funding from the Council to continue with the Tai Chi classes, excellent support from shops as usual – especially Spar - almost sold-out calendar sales.

The Christmas tree shredding was successful again, he expressed huge gratitude to the volunteers who turned up on the day to help with erecting and taking trees down. Festival Week stalls are already being booked - Forum purchasing a new strimmer and leaf blower for Lydgate Green and Hagg Copse.

PCSO's Report

Pam Thompson sent a report; Pam and Phil have changed their working patterns so do not seem to be seen as much, but do work from the police building on Lydgate Lane. They left some handouts about bike crime (registering your bike online), door/window stickers about cold callers, and discount information for Disklok steering wheel devices. For the last three months there has been an increase in motor vehicle theft across the city (see page 13) Vehicle key fobs, when not being used, are BEST KEPT in a Faraday pouch or tin box, and vehicles immobilized with some sort of steering-wheel device. BE VIGILANT!

John D rose to say this level of local crime is much higher than it used to be – what is happening?

Councillors Questions and Report

1. Nearing year end, any grants must be applied for and money spent – environmental or green projects in particular. Any ideas to Ian and Steve please.

2.Another Manchester Rd pedestrian crossing has reached the top of the discussion list. Amey road maintenance – e.g. Watt Lane/Dransfield - Hagg Hill, large and long potholes at the top pose a danger to drivers and cyclists, resurfacing required urgently - to improve visibility and compliance, single yellow line adjacent to Papa Cicio - Elise requires repainting.

3.The Council stopped putting down any form of speed bumps in 2011; Amey cannot 'improve'

roads by adding things like this, just repair them.

4.Data on the rat running and bad parking on Cairns Rd and Selborne Rd will be needed for any work to be done.

5.Bad parking – e.g. on yellow lines – please photograph and send in – the Police Op 'Park Safe' has won national awards.

6.VLIS (Volunteer libraries in Sheffield) will be celebrating 10 years in the autumn – bids for money to celebrate this with events should be directed to the individual Ward Pots.

7.Electric car charging points? The only place in Crosspool large enough would be the Tavern car park.

8.Storm Babet, severe damage to the Rivelin Valley? The Councillors will try to find out who has been tasked with repairing the storm damage – the recent Stannington by election has slowed things down.

KEŠ (King Edwards School) Report

KES teaches 1700 students from Year 7-14, and has "forged fantastic links" with the community, shops, families etc; it is "one of the most prestigious schools in Sheffield", and everyone is "tremendously proud of its achievements". They have an "ambitious learning community " with "very high expectations", and a lot of additional support is available where needed. Pupils travel in from places like Stannington, Bradfield, Stocksbridge, Sharrow and the town centre. They have strong links with Tapton School & Notre Dame, and work to support them all arriving at

the same time in the morning. Their academic results are excellent with 5 students going to Oxbridge last autumn, and high numbers to Russell Group universities. They have "robust personal programmes" with education on safeguarding, charitable work, mental health, knife crime, vaping etc. – a forward thinking establishment! They also have the best training for their staff too. They "want the kids to embrace the community" – if you see a problem do contact the office. They are involved in the local flower planting, litter picking, Summer Fayre etc., and any incidents are "few and far between". They have been observing the annual waxwing migration, 'Crossie' Lydgate Lane tawny owl, and partaking in nature walks etc. The school raised over £1k for Children in Need, hold wheelchair rugby sessions, & cook & serve meals at Wesley Hall regularly. Their eco -committee has been looking at insect -friendly planting, recycling, held a Christmas Fayre and a Remembrance Day ceremony, and are involved in the Duke of Edinburgh award scheme. They work with Sheffield Wednesday football club on respect & personal safety, and have visited Sheffield Cutlers and Forgemasters. As well as sending in info for publication in the Clarion the Head Teacher has a regular bulletin online.

5.The Orchard had a good apple crop again but needs some severe pruning work this year. Do look out for wild flowers at Hagg Copse, and come along to help the Lydgate Green bedding team in the spring.

6.The precinct planters have winter and then spring planting again. Car boot sales – watch

this space.



PERMACULTURE ART.1



In the next few Clarions, I've been given the opportunity to discuss the ideas and practices of permaculture. Permaculture is a set of design principles that promotes place-based living, mutual care, and cultivating competence. It's usually associated with food production, land management, and community organisation, but can be applied anywhere. Your nearest permaculture enterprise that ticks all these boxes is only down the road at Holly Hagg Community Alpaca Farm!

In coming Clarions, I'll introduce core concepts of permaculture and task you with applying them for mutual benefit. To get started, before the next Clarion, take a moment outside to notice what moves or changes. Maybe you notice rainwater flowing down the drain, a person walking down your street, a bird perching on an awning in the precinct. Now, wonder how you would set up so that these

things happen; not forcing them to happen, facilitating them.

Perhaps, you notice that the camber in the road facilitates rather than forces the rain toward the drain. Perhaps, you notice that you are more inclined to walk a route down a verdant street rather than where a signpost directs you. Take everything you notice that you enjoy and consider how you would set up to promote all the things at once. Can what facilitates one, facilitate another?

Permaculture isn't just about healthy land, nutritious food, or local culture. It's about cultivating all those things at the same time such that each aids the other. I hope you'll find some interest in these articles and maybe we can play with some permaculture projects along the way.

It always looks very nice and colourful.


* What do you think of the Christmas tree display?

North West Neighbourhoods carried out a 2 day operation in Crookes, Fulwood and Crosspool in relation to Theft of and from vehicles. This included PC's and PCSO's

crime prevention / scene visits to 5 victims of recent vehicle crime.

- identified 66 vehicles that were vulnerable to crime, mainly around keyless thefts and high value vehicles and visited and gave advice to the owners of these vehicles.
- stopped and engaged with at least 9 vehicle owners and advised them around keeping their vehicle safe.
- PCSO's carried out a "Checkpoint" on Redmires Road where they stopped and gave vehicle safety advice to 23 vehicle drivers, mainly around keyless thefts.
- proactively stopped a vehicle smelling of cannabis and searched 4 occupants, one of which was dealt with for possession of cannabis, reported another driver for no insurance, and gained intelligence through carrying out other proactive stops.



The Sheffield Astronomical Society is an amateur society serving the Sheffield and South Yorkshire area to promote and encourage a popular interest in astronomy and space sciences among the general public. meet twice a month on the second and fourth Tuesdays at

the Ranmoor Parish Centre - 5 Ranmoor Park Road, Sheffield S10 3GX - at 7:30pm.

THE RIVELIN VALLEY CONSERVATION GROUP

On October 30th 2023, Storm Babet delivered a devastating blow to Rivelin Valley. Many footpaths, some weakened by previous storms along the Rivelin nature trail, suffered serious surface damage and some were completely washed away. Tons of grit, stone, boulders and tree trunks were washed down the valley, creating new islands, forcing the river to divert, destroying weirs and blocking the water flow to some of the dams. About a week after the storm, the water levels had subsided enough for the RVCG task team to begin remedial work which began by digging out the head goits of Frank Wheel and Wolf Wheel. The RVCG task team numbers swelled to around 30, many attending for the first time, such was the urgency

felt by locals. The November and January task days also saw a high attendance when further footpaths were reinstated, retaining walls repaired and fallen trees and debris removed. The Sheffield City Council kindly agreed to meet with the RVCG on Wed 7th Feb to discuss plans for restoration of the Rivelin Nature trail and also plans for Rivelin to achieve the status of Local Nature Reserve. The RVCG has a strong following and a committed number of volunteers.
